Temptation into Trust

It was an ordinary Tuesday with the exception that it was Kara's first day in the Regional Youth Assessment Center. The plan was for Kara, our newest volunteer, to observe and become familiar with our Juvenile Justice Ministry. God was moving to make it a day three of us will never forget.

Upon entering the day room, Leroy* scrambled to the bookshelf grabbing a few bibles so we could read. I had met with Leroy the day prior and knew he had tough questions and was seeking answers from every available source offered to him. We sat down at a round table where Kara introduced and shared a little about herself. He is very social, but very straight forward. Leroy reciprocated by telling a little about himself but was more eager to read and seek answers to his questions.

We opened up the bible and began reading from John Chapter 1. John points to Jesus always being part of the Godhead. He was the word, He was in the beginning, and in Him was life and light. In the process of reading this chapter, we shared the gospel. Leroy was absorbing all that we read and explained. His actions placed Jesus on the cross and he understood Jesus' sacrifice.

At the same time, he had a nagging question about temptation Leroy wanted to know if God was tempting him. We opened up to James Chapter 1. God was speaking directly to Leroy as James wrote, "Let no one say when he is tempted, 'I am being tempted by God,' for God cannot be tempted with evil, and he himself tempts no one. But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire. The desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death." Leroy was living in the darkness and the evil one's temptation was the root of why he was incarcerated. Yet, the evil one placed the blame on God.

That day, Leroy heard the truth! His eyes were opened. He met Jesus and understood Jesus' great love for him. He also understood that Jesus never intended that kind of life for him. Leroy turned away from his sinful nature that day and declared Jesus as Lord and personal Savior of his life.

I will be learning to shepherd others like Jesus shepherds each of us. I plan on taking time to be in the moment with my family as this year is full of transitions and life changes.

Our chapter remains committed to God's mission and His youth in the Grand Forks Area. So I anticipate our team to continue to pursue 11-19 year olds sharing the gospel and engaging them in healthy and positive relationships. We have plenty of clubs, events, and activities planned. Pray our efforts to connect with teens will produce life to their story; an eternal life in Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

Earning the Right to be Heard

Recently, I listened to a podcast episode where the speaker was talking about the ministry of "reclining". If you are like me, you might be thinking, "I wonder where this is going". The speaker continued sharing the times Jesus is recorded to be reclining with others in the Bible: around the table at The Last Supper as well as when the woman poured perfume over His feet. The speaker went on to make a point that Jesus unhurriedly spent time with others as He ministered to them. There was no time limit or rushing to another appointment, but the simplicity of giving Himself away to care for those in His presence. It made me think how as Christians, we are challenged to do the same. Often for me this is difficult because I like to plan my day in the way I want it to go. However, I am learning the essentiality and beauty of patiently spending time with others as we minister to them, especially when it comes to youth.

In the fall of 2023, Grand Forks YFC added a new ministry site to our Campus Life Clubs—Red River High School. It was there we engaged a young man named Nick*. Upon invitation to hang out with us, he told us he didn't believe in God. I responded, "That's all right, your welcome to come hangout and have a donut!" Nick consistently came to every club after that. At club, he had the freedom to express his thoughts, ask questions, and build relationships. He often made remarks like, "You are the only friends I have," and "Can we do this more than once a week?" Often times, I could come to club with prepared lessons and the youth that were there would dive deep into the topic and passionately share their perspectives. I learned I needed to surrender my idea of my plan for club and allow God to work His. I needed to recline with the youth, listen to them, and respond to their thoughts. By doing this, I would also earn the right to be heard by them.

When summer was nearing, Nick let us know that he was very interested in coming to YFC Camp. We spent 104.5 hours with Nick that week pouring into him and showing him that he can be himself around us. At the end of the week, after the Gospel presentation and response, a medical event occurred with a youth (she is okay). This specific circumstance triggered a traumatic memory for Nick and he began to panic. I addressed Nick and tried to walk him through what was going on. Nick felt safe to share his memories that were scarred with violence and the loss of life. He confessed that it was those memories that keep him from believing in God and being able to show his true self. I felt the importance of listening with patience and asked him if had shared these thoughts before. He responded, "I've kept it in for two years, but sharing feels like such a relief." After I listened to him, he was more willing to hear God-centered responses to his story. I then encouraged him to open up with his male counselor and other male leaders here as they could connect with him even more deeply than I was able to.

Later that evening, Nick had connected with Sean who continued spiritually pouring into him. He expressed interest in wanting to return to camp and maybe someday being a counselor at a YFC camp. Sean asked, "Looking back at September, did you think you would be here right now?" Nick jokingly responded, "No... basically, donuts saved my life!"

We hope, pray, and trust someday Nick will let Jesus save his life. We spent all year reclining with Nick and all week at camp to earn the right to hear his story so we can continue to minister to his heart personally. Thank you for your support so we can continue going to Nick and other kids like him who so desperately want to be heard, know they're cared for, and crave to know truth. We know God has not given up on Nick and your support enables and proves that we have not either.

4 Grand Forks Teens New to the Kingdom

YFC SUMMER CAMP- 185 students from across North Dakota attended camp this summer. Camp is a special place found on earth where teens are removed from the world and all its distractions for a week to focus on and be surrounded by God in every activity. This year, we partnered with Gospel Outreach sending a total of 19 boys and girls from Grand Forks to camp. The theme was Bedrock Faith. During the invitation, 8 youth repented of their sin and asked Jesus to be their Lord and personal Savior. What is even more exciting is that <u>4 of 8</u> were from

Grand Forks. Additionally, 135 youth responded to the invitation in other ways that night, including two Grand Forks girls who recommitted their lives to Christ. The Holy Spirit was moving so strongly that for two hours after the invitation, the students just sang worship songs in the chapel and all the evenings activities were canceled.



Newfound Sense of Self, Community, & God

YFC SUMMER BACKPACK— June of 2024 brought a great deal of rain across the plains and into MN. Due to the rain, we received news that some campsites at George H. Crosby Manitou State Park had been flooded out and were no longer usable. Thankfully, we had accidentally reserved a campsite (divine planning by God) on a hilltop for our trip. Four teens boys and two leaders accepted the challenge of the hilltop with



perseverance and grace as they trekked up and down every evening to retrieve water for camp. At the beginning of the trip, the boys were either strangers or acquaintances with each other as they came from each Campus Life Ministry site. However, by the end they were friends as they encouraged one another and worked as a team. These young men learned survival skills and also grew in confidence. Zane*, in particular, began the trip unsure of himself and his potential, but by the end he had a new sense of self and what he could do. As he began to trust his community, Zane felt comforta-

ble to ask questions about God during the daily devotionals. This trip was full of spiritual seed-plantings, and we cannot wait to see how God continues to grow them this fall.

Jesus' Compassion is Life-Changing

YFC SUMMER BASH— 22 young people from Grand Forks, East Grand Forks, and Thompson responded to God's invitation to Summer Bash at the end of July. This event was covered in prayer requesting God to

bring who He wanted to hear Jonnie Sharp's (current Red River Campus Life Volunteer), story. The morning of Summer Bash, we unexpectedly met 4 new young people and saw 8 we hadn't seen all summer long! The day was filled with authentic-Christ-sharing relationships between leaders and youth. These are essential to reach young people with the Gospel. James*, a teen who is at a pivotal point in his life as he is soon to be starting his freshman year of high school, made an important decision that day that he



wanted a friend in Jesus in high school and he needed Him for his salvation. James had heard the Gospel presented to him several times in the 2023-2024 school year as he was a regular attender of Campus Life Clubs at Valley, but he was never ready to take the step to follow Jesus. As Jonnie shared at Summer Bash and James related to the darkness and despair in the beginning, he was better able to see the light and hope of the compassion of Jesus when Jonnie and his father encountered Him. James decided he wanted that for himself upon hearing the invitation that the compassion of Jesus is for anyone who wants it. The remainder of the day God held off the rain and we continued to live out what Jonnie spoke of Jesus with these teens!
